This communal event will focus on updating articles relating to gender, art, and feminism. Participants are asked to bring a laptop, power cord and ideas for entries that need updating and creation. Those who are editing-averse are also asked to stop by and show their support!

Less than 10% of Wikimedia contributors are women – specifically those who edit existing articles. This gathering seeks to help shift that. People of all gender identities and expressions are invited to participate, particularly transgender and cisgender women. Participants are asked to create a Wikipedia account prior to the event.
