BUZZ LAB 8.0 TEEN INTERNSHIP

DESCRIPTION

Buzz Lab 8.0 will be a four-day paid internship during Summer 2021 for teens interested in art, science, and the environment. Buzz Lab interns engage in learning, teaching, creating, sustaining and advocating for the livelihood of pollinators in a healthy ecosystem.



Buzz Lab interns will work with scientists, artists, and teachers to learn and discuss the importance of pollinators, create works of public art, and participate in gardening and research in the Pollinator Garden at Plains Art Museum and other sites. This year there will be 16 spots available to first or second-year interns. Interns who have participated in Buzz Lab for 2 years or more will apply for a leadership team position. Approximately 6 interns will be chosen for the leadership team.

Interns must firmly commit to working four days on June 28th -July 1st and 3 follow-up virtual sessions on Thursdays in July, with a final in-person session on July 29th.

This is an 8-day paid internship: After completing the first 4 days June 28 - July 1 (9 AM - 4 PM), participants will be paid \$120.00. For follow up 3 virtual sessions on one in person in July, participants will be paid \$30.00 for each full day and \$15 for each half day.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Ages 14-18 on the first day of the internship (June 28, 2021) may apply.
- Must be available from June 28th July 1st. 4 additional dates of July 8th, 15th, 22nd, and 29th
- Transportation to and from the Museum (704 First Ave. N., downtown Fargo) is preferred. We understand that this may be a hardship for some families; please note on the application if you will need help with transportation.
- Sessions may be held virtually. If access to WiFi or a WiFi Capable device is a barrier please note on the application.
- Demonstrates enthusiasm and willingness to work as part of a team.
- We encourage students interested in art, science, and the environment to apply, especially those who would be the first to attend college in their family and those from diverse communities.

- If this person is applying to be on the leadership team: why would they make a good leader?
